Yet these same palm branches we bring home after mass are a reminder that whether in celebration or in tribulation, we must be with Jesus. We must stay with Him especially in His trials and suffering.

So, as we bring home these palm branches, let us also walk with Jesus in His triumphant procession into Jerusalem, and especially stay close to Him in the procession towards execution which will unfold before us in the days to come, because we too will be tested. We too will face our own agonies, betrayals, pains, loneliness, suffering in this life. If we only join them to the Lord's passion, our trials and tribulations in this life are nothing compared to the glory awaiting us at the end of times.

SUNDAY READINGS AND BACKGROUNDS PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

In response to Pope Francis' urgent call to the new evangelization and his challenge to families to love according to Gospel values, each week in the bulletin our parish will offer a great opportunity to involve the entire family. There will be a short explanation of the three reading with possible questions to help us reflect on and apply the Gospel message to our lives. There are suggested questions for children, the youth and adults. May this parish endeavor help all of us deepen our relationship with the Lord.

Reading I : Isaiah 50:4-7 God helps us.

The first reading from Isaiah is one of four passages that focus on the "servant" of God. In all four examples, the servant is faithful, even in the face of suffering. The servant in today's passage stands by his belief that with God on his side, he will not be put to shame.

Reading II : **Philippians 2:6-11** God's name is holy.

Scripture scholars believe that today's second reading was a familiar early Christian hymn. The purpose of Paul's hymn for the Philippians is to persuade the community to be united in Christ. Paul uses the example of Jesus' self emptying obedience to encourage the community to end its divisions.

Gospel : <u>Luke 22:14-23:56</u> Jesus shows us how to love.

Similar to the description of the servant of Isaiah, Jesus willingly accepted the suffering and anguish that can be the price of fidelity. Throughout the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is depicted as the faithful prophet who speaks God's word even in the midst of his own suffering. In today's account of the Passion of Christ, Luke emphasizes the innocence of Jesus.

Questions of the Week

Theme: Jesus shows us how much He truly loves us.

Question for Children:

In your own words, what does the suffering and death of Christ mean to you?

Question for Youth:

How can you spend time with each member of your family this week in a way that will communicate your love for them?

Question for Adults:

In your own words, what does the suffering and death of Christ mean to you?
